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About the CST: La Commission supérieure technique de l'image et du son (CST) is the oldest association of film and audiovisual technicians in France. It was founded in 1944 and promotes the quality of technical know-how and the quality of the end result presented to spectators.

Created in 1951, the CST Award for best Artist-Technician - formerly the Grand Prix Technique - recognises an exceptional contribution by a technical artist to a film in the official competition.

Created in 2021, the CST Award for best Young, Female Film Technician strives to promote professional equality between men and women in the film industry, and underlines the CST's desire to give visibility to the high-quality cinematographic work produced every year by young female technicians.

Ruben Impens

Ruben Impens is a director of photography. He is best known for his work with Felix van Groeningen and Julia Ducournau and has become the director of photography of all their feature films.

Ruben Impens was awarded the Kodak prize for best photography at the Hamptons International Film Festival for *The Misfortunates* (2009) and his work on *The Broken Circle Breakdown* (2012) was rewarded with the Ensor prize for best photography. Ruben Impens won the Magritte prize for best photography for his work on *Titane* (2021).

Stéphane Thiébaut

Stéphane Thiébaut is a mixer. He graduated from the Sound department at the Femis in 1991 and became its director in 2018. He is best known for his work on *The Substance* (2024), *Titane* (2021) and *DogMan* (2023).

Éponine Momenceau

Eponine graduated in 2011 from the Image department at the FEMIS film school and went on to work as director of photography on fictional and documentary films. She was one of the nominees for the CST Prize for young, female film technician at the 76th Cannes Film Festival. She was also the director of photography of Alex Lutz's previous film, « Une Nuit », shown in the Certain Regard section.
